## **What does a typical day look like?**

I will receive a job/ticket and get in contact with the other engineer that I will be working with that day to confirm the location and start time. When arriving at my location I check any paperwork and complete my safety checks before starting my tasks. I inform my point of contact with the progress made, whether the work is complete or not and what will need to be done going forward.

## **What are you most looking forward to in your apprenticeship?**

Working in different locations across the world and learning new and exciting parts of my job role.

## **What is your greatest achievement as part of the apprenticeship?**

Working in Cyprus has been the greatest achievement of my apprenticeship so far.
