## What made you apply for an apprenticeship?

Sometimes I'm the only woman on site, which was a bit daunting at times, especially when I first started. However, as the role provides constant challenges, I am continuously pushing the boundaries of my comfort zone and it feels like my confidence has skyrocketed.

## What part of the role gives you the most personal satisfaction?

## What does a typical day look like?

Typically it starts with a briefing, going over safety requirements and our tasks for the day on site. Throughout the day I will complete varied tasks, while checking in with my supervisor.
